The "scarf game" or "blackout challenge" is a dangerous challenge in which children block their breath to faint to experience strong sensations and cause dozens of accidents each year, some "We didn't know she was participating in this game. We knew Antonella was coming to TikTok for choreography, to watch videos. But how could I imagine

this atrocity? My daughter, my little A., has died because of an extreme game, on TikTok. How can I accept such a thing? "said the girl's father.)
